### **Today's Trivia**

Henry VIII had a court of 1,000 courtiers who all had to be fed and at that time there was a need for lavish consumption to prove to enemies he was rich enough to waste money. Consequently, some 200 people were employed in the royal kitchens at Hampton Court and in a typical year the royal kitchen served 8,200 sheep, 2,330 deer, 1,870 pigs, 1,240 oxen, 760 calves and 53 wild boar. Before Henry ate, a servant known as 'the sewer' washed his hands with heated, scented water and dried them on a silk towel.

Henry VIII was King of England from 1509 - 1547. Originally a strong Catholic, he wanted to divorce his first wife Catherine of Aragon and marry Anne Boleyn against the decree of the Pope. As a result, Henry

*rejected the Pope and Catholicism and set himself up as Head of the Church of England. This was the beginning of the Anglican Church and the Protestant Reformation which consequently swept across northern Europe.*

### ***Tomorrow's Trivia***

The knights took it literally and murdered Becket in his own cathedral. Henry II was appalled and came to Canterbury to ask for forgiveness. From this time Canterbury became a place of pilgrimage for Christians who came to pay homage to the saint.*

## **Today's Trivia**

*All about Wellington: The school was built as a national monument to the first Duke of Wellington, Arthur Wellesley, who defeated Napoleon at the Battle of Waterloo in 1815, putting the Duke in the top rank of Britain's military heroes. Her Majesty Queen Victoria, Prince Albert and the Prime Minister of the day, Lord Edward Stanley, decided to open the school as a charitable educational institution for the orphans of army officers. Queen Victoria inaugurated the school's public opening ceremony on the 29<sup>th</sup> January 1859. Since then, the privilege of eligibility has been extended to the orphan children of deceased officers in the Royal Navy, Royal Marines and Royal Air Force, to the deceased servicemen or servicewomen of Her Majesty's Armed Forces, irrespective of rank, and to the orphan children of persons who have died in acts of selfless bravery.*
