Packing Information

Laundry is done once during the programme, so students do not need to pack a large amount and should only bring one medium-size suitcase.

During ISCA our students are part of a global community. To that end, our dress code expectations are designed to be respectful of the historic and cultural sites that we will visit during the programme.

- Clothing should be clean, in good condition, and appropriately sized.
- Political symbols or slogans may not be worn.
- Inappropriate language or graphics are not permitted.
- Shorts or skirts should be no shorter than fingertip length.
- Shirts must cover the entire torso.
- Acceptable shirts include t-shirts, collared shirts, and tank-tops.
- Necklines on shirts should be modest.
- Trousers or shorts must be worn around the waist.

Clothing List

All clothing should be machine-washable and clearly marked, we are unable to accept responsibility for items that are lost, damaged or left behind.

We highly recommend bringing a warm, waterproof winter coat with a hood instead of an umbrella. An umbrella is completely impractical at most of the places we visit.

We will be visiting Scotland during winter. Please be prepared for all weathers including sun, rain, snow and wind. If you dress for the right conditions, your experience will be even more enjoyable.

Travel Adaptors

In the UK we use a 'G' plug with three rectangular pins in a triangle pattern. Please note, UK voltage is 230V.

If you are plugging in electrical equipment that is rated at a lower voltage you will need a voltage converter or transformer whilst in the UK.

Our campus has a responsibility to check for electrical safety during the programme, so please ensure these rules are followed for the safety of all.
