### Job Overview

During the three weeks our staff will lead the tours when we are off campus and run the sports and activities during our on-campus days. All our staff should be comfortable working with 12 to 15-year-olds, with previous experience of this age group preferable. ISCA staff are committed to giving our students a thorough understanding of British history and culture, either through the places we visit or through the sports and activities we do on campus.

Additionally, ISCA staff will have a pastoral role in the boarding houses. Each campus has 4 boarding houses with at least 3 ISCA staff in each house. An ISCA staff member will therefore be responsible for the students on their floor, ensuring they are in their rooms after lights out, wake up on time in the morning and monitor any homesickness or pastoral problems as and when they develop. Staff will be required to communicate any issues with their Head of House and the International Chaperone effectively, as well as carry out roles as required by their Head of House, On-Campus Director or Programme Director.

## Summary of Main Responsibilities

- To ensure each student has a happy and truly memorable three weeks.
- To enhance the students' knowledge of every site we visit.
- To encourage, and on occasion, lead the students to explore each site in small groups, providing them with clear instructions on the meeting points and timings throughout the day.
- To be knowledgeable about each and every place we visit, so you can give an academic talk on the coach if required and share information with students and chaperones.
- To teach a range of different sports to groups of approximately 30 students during on-campus days.
- To supervise evening activities.
- To work in a team with other ISCA staff members and the international chaperones to ensure the programme runs smoothly.

## Other Duties

- To wake the students up every morning and to make sure they are in bed every night.
- To accompany the coaches to the airport to collect and drop off students.
- To write the ISCA Blog on two occasions during the ISCA Programme.
- To take photos on the ISCA Camera on at least one occasion during the ISCA Programme.
- To carry out basic first aid in emergency situations, in conjunction with the ISCA Medical Officer.
- To implement ISCA's Terrorism Response Policy in the very unlikely event of an attack during the programme.
- To work alongside the international chaperones when dealing with any issues of homesickness.
- To prepare the sports equipment and houses for student arrival on the first day.
- To clean up the houses and put away sports equipment on the final day.
- To stay on campus until every student has left for the airport on the final day.

## Location

We have two campuses. Successful applicants will be allocated to either:

- Charterhouse School, Godalming, Surrey
- Cranleigh School, Cranleigh, Surrey

## Pay

Pay is competitive and increases based on experience. ISCA provides your food and lodgings, entrance to each place we visit and all transport during the programme. You will have at least 4 days off (9am-5.30pm) during the three weeks.
