About ISCA

Students travel as part of a school group and are accompanied by a senior teacher from their school, creating a supportive and well-supervised environment throughout the programme.

The ISCA Summer Programme is a three-week experience exploring historic, cultural and modern sites across England. The programme is based at the beautiful Cranleigh School campus, where students also participate in a wide range of sports and activities.

Position Type: Voluntary leadership development role

The ISCA Academy provides former ISCA students with the opportunity to gain valuable leadership and teaching experience while supporting the delivery of the summer programme.

Working alongside experienced ISCA staff, ISCA Academy members assist with tours, activities and student supervision while developing skills in communication, leadership and pastoral care.

Role Overview

During the three-week programme, ISCA Academy members support ISCA staff both on tour and on campus.

On tour days, you will assist with supervising students as they visit major historic and cultural sites across southern England. On campus days, you will help lead sports, arts and activity sessions that encourage international friendship and teamwork.

ISCA Academy members should feel comfortable working with students aged 12–15. Previous experience working with this age group is helpful but not essential.

In addition to programme support, ISCA Academy members assist with pastoral care in the boarding houses, helping to ensure students feel safe, supported and included throughout their stay.

Pastoral Responsibilities

Each programme includes four boarding houses, with experienced ISCA staff supervising each house.

ISCA Academy members support the Head of House and other staff by helping to monitor student wellbeing and maintaining a positive residential environment.

Responsibilities may include:

- Ensuring students are in their rooms after lights out
- Helping students wake up and prepare for the day
- Supporting students experiencing homesickness
- Communicating any concerns to the Head of House or International Chaperones
- Assisting with general supervision in the boarding houses

Summary of Main Responsibilities

- Help ensure every student enjoys a safe, positive and memorable three-week experience.
- Support the educational element of the programme by sharing information about the places we visit.
- Supervise students exploring sites in small groups, ensuring they understand meeting points and timings.
- Assist with coach briefings and provide historical context when appropriate.
- Support the delivery of sports and activities during on-campus days (typically with groups of around 30 students).
- Assist with the supervision of evening activities.
- Work collaboratively with ISCA staff and international chaperones to ensure the programme runs smoothly.

Additional Duties

- Help wake students in the morning and ensure they are in bed at lights out.
- Assist with airport transfers when welcoming and departing school groups.
- Contribute to the ISCA Blog on two occasions during the programme.
- Take photographs for ISCA's social media, marketing and website.
- Assist with basic first aid support alongside the ISCA Medical Officer.
- Support staff and chaperones when responding to homesickness or pastoral issues.
- Assist with preparing sports equipment and boarding houses before student arrival.
- Help tidy boarding houses and equipment at the end of the programme.

Accommodation and Expenses

ISCA provides:

- Flights to and from the UK
- Accommodation at Cranleigh School
- All meals during the programme
- Entrance to all sites and attractions visited
- Transport throughout the programme

ISCA Academy members will also receive at least four days off (9:00am - 5:30pm) during the three-week programme.
